Mike's Testimony

Warriors Path, State Park, July 16, 2016

I praise Yahweh for His gift of Yeshua and that we might know the height, the breadth, and the depth of His love. He desires and expects us to love others and said the weightier matters of His commands are justice, mercy, and faith.

It is mercy to heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the disease, and cast out unclean spirits. Matthew 10:8

It is faith to try to do so.

Yeshua said we expect these signs to accompany those who believe, they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall get well. Mark 16:17-18



So, for those of you who were not there, we set up the tents and bottles of water to hand out as it was 95 degrees. Our commission as a part of this Living Stone Torah Outreach was to go out and, as we went, to listen to the Holy Spirit, "My sheep hear my voice, I know them, and they follow me." John 10:27

You go out and submit to His Spirit, and He will lead you to people to share love and share the gospel with.

So this was my experience from that day.

I was at the park, and after we finished setting up the tents, I grabbed my small backpack and began walking down the asphalt path. As I did, I saw a man in a red shirt sitting at a picnic table in a grove of trees. It was in a shady area, somewhat hidden and overlooked the park. I started having a conversation with the Holy Spirit, wondering if this was the person He wanted me to approach and share His love with.

I shrugged it off and kept walking, saying hello to a couple who passed me on the path and wondered if they were the ones? So, I kept walking and looked up the hill, and again, I felt I need to go up the hill. As I did, I approached the man in the enclave of trees from behind. It occurred to me as I was approaching him, "This is crazy, and this guy is going to think I'm weird and will be wondering what is going on?"

So, I was having two conversations in my head simultaneously. Meanwhile, the Holy Spirit kept drawing me towards Him in a way I can't explain except, it gave me peace, and I felt calm in the process.

I said hello and asked the man in the red shirt if I could sit at his table. I would not know till later how big of a deal it was for him to be around a stranger. We made small talk for a while about how hot it was, and then I said to him, "I know why you are up here man, the breeze up here is wonderful!"

We then began to talk about many things, one of them being our grandparents. It's incredible that when you are listening to the Holy Spirit, He will plant seeds of conversation to connect with people.

We connected on how much we both loved our grandparents, and they loved and cared for us. He shared with me that his mum abandoned him at age 5, was sold, and abused.

At age 11, his grandparents came and took him back and raised him. They were the amazing people who first showed him love and acceptance in life.

This was the kind of conversation the Holy Spirit was drawing us into; I shared about how much I loved my grandparents and how they too were the first people in my life who showed me, unconditional love.

In our conversation, he told me how he cared for his grandmother before she died and as he was sharing, I heard the Holy Spirit say it was cancer. I told him it was cancer that caused her death. He looked surprised at how I would know and confirmed that yes, it was cancer.

I came to understand this was a word of knowledge that Yahweh uses in His ministry to show love and, ultimately, understanding how we can often pray for them.

We went on to talk about our lives and his career before he became disabled. He worked for 30 years in the electrical industry as a power linesman, climbing, building, and maintaining power lines. One day, he said, after an ice storm, he was doing repairs and was injured when a 700lb pole fell on him, breaking his jaw, knocked out and shattered his teeth, and broke his neck. He showed me his teeth and then asked me to come over to his side of the picnic table and pulled back his shirt to show me the scars on the back of his neck. He had a big cone on his spine where the break was when the pole fell on him. He went onto say he could no longer work because he was in chronic pain but was unable to take pain medication. I assumed it was because of the cost that he was not taking them. He seemed depressed and resigned to that being his condition in life. It was amazing that he was professing 'Jesus' but was resigned to this being his lot in life and was depressed, and this was our conversation.

We kept talking about life, and I was amazed at the peace surrounding us during the entire conversation.

I kept hearing a voice in the form of an impression, consistently saying, "He will be healed today; I am going to heal Him today. Tell him I am going to heal him today." What immediately went on in my mind was, "What! is this really what's going to happen???" Again, "Tell him he is going to be healed today." The voice kept reminding me that today was the day.

Then, I finally got the courage to ask him his full name, and he told me very specifically what his name was. I said his name back to him, and I told him God wanted him to be healed today. I repeated it and asked if he wished to have prayer? At first, he stared at me, wondering if I was serious about God wanting to heal him that day. I repeated it and asked if he wanted prayer. I asked him three times, and on the third time, he said, "Ok, I want prayer."

At that time, I looked down the hill and saw my friend, Kenny, and I said to the man, "I would like to ask my friend to come with me, and we would like to pray for you." He replied, "Yes."

I went down the hill and found Kenny, and all the while, I was thinking, "Oh man, what did you do, what did you get yourself into?" Kenny said, "Sure, I'll go up the hill with you and pray with you." So, we bounced up the hill together, and I introduced Kenny to the man. We visited together for a few minutes while he showed Kenny the scars and the mound on his spine.

We laid hands on him, and Kenny started praying a very simple prayer, and then we prayed together in tongues. It was probably 2-3 minutes, and it was done.

Kenny walked around his side of the picnic table, I walked around mine, and we both sat down again; the man didn't look any different.

We proceeded to have a friendly conversation and continued our visit with him. Kenny ministered to him and spoke to him about his antisocial behavior, his fears, and his anxiety of wanting to hide from people. This was strange for me, and I was thinking, "Kenny, what are you doing? We just prayed for this man, and we're nice to him, and now you're having a go at him!" But what I witnessed was Kenny understood things about ministry I had no clue about. He had picked up on why the man was up in that place because he had antisocial behavior, anxiety, and fear of people. Kenny was speaking to him and saying, "Hey, you can't live life in isolation. This is not the life you are called to; Satan wants to keep you separated from people."

So, Kenny ministered to him, and about that time, dinner was being served down in the tent area, so we invited him for dinner. He wasn't happy at first and kept hesitating. I asked him three times before he finally came down for dinner.

So, we sat down at the table, and I was trying to make conversation with him to make him more comfortable and keep him calm. I was asking him what it was like to be a power linesman. In the middle of our conversation, he leaned over to me and said, "Mike, I can't feel any pain anymore." I looked at him and high-fived him, and said, "Praise God! He loves you so much." So, we kept on talking about other things, and again he said, "Mike, I want to share with you; I can't feel any pain anymore. You don't understand, Mike, that I live with chronic pain every day, and I don't have any more pain."

I replied, "Praise God, isn't He good!" and we continued our conversation. Then the third time, he said, "I am so excited, you don't get it. I'm going to jump out of this chair. I'm so excited!!" I said, "Praise God, isn't he good."

And so, that was our time at dinner, and it was awesome and beautiful and inspired by the Ruach HaKodesh.

At the end of that evening, we got to rejoice together, this man and I, about how good God is and how much God loved him enough to heal him.

So, that was my first experience at Living Stone Torah Outreach.

WHAT IS LIVING STONE TORAH OUTREACH?

The mission is to invest in training people to also teach others to go out and so on. For three days, we provide training for evangelism and street work. We then come together as a group to share testimonies at the end of day and prepare the next mornings outreach.

"See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame." Isaiah 28:16 Yeshua is this cornerstone.

It is time for us to wake up and apply the commission that the Father has called every single one of us to. We are all called to witness, to reach out, and to make a difference. We are a chosen people, and if we stop or slow down, we will miss out on the demonstration power of the Holy Spirit and many incredible opportunities.

Mission 1

This is probably the first time I have looked at what God is doing and seen it as an actual mission. All the signs were there, visions, dreams, and words of knowledge in preparation for what was to come.

The event: Camping for a week on a river with a few family members and then a whole lot of people I didn't know. If I had known this was the case, I would have said a straight NO in the beginning when I was invited. I am pretty reserved and enjoy solitude and the company of those familiar to me. To say this was a terrifying thought is accurate. I knew I would be way out of my comfort zone. As far as I knew, I was going to be the only believer in a group of no-nonsense, very outdoorsy, and very worldly Aussie folk.

I procrastinated so much to get ready that I was the last to arrive and had to set my tent up in the dark. All the while, I was secretly hoping and praying that I could get out of it!

"Not my will, but your will be done!" I whispered in my mind.

I went to bed early the first few nights as I didn't want to stay up while they were drinking and cussing, no judgment here, years ago, I would have fitted in quite well with this crowd, but the Holy Spirit has changed me, and that is not me anymore.

Then I was given a vision of my grandson, who is only a toddler, falling from a height, so I prayed and became super aware of where he was. He was in places he shouldn't have been multiple times but was always seen in time before he had a chance to get hurt. Praise Yehovah!

I'm not sure why but toddlers seem to have an inbuilt magnet for danger.

Our days were filled with fishing, eating, exploring the area, and watching and playing with the kids, normal camping activities. But what wasn't normal for me anymore was drinking a lot, eating bacon, pork belly, prawns, and huge, freshly caught and cooked, beautiful mud crabs straight out of the river, all stuff I used to love to eat but now choose not to because I follow Yeshua and the food laws in the Bible. I don't know if you have been in this situation before, but it was excruciating saying no to all these things and seeing the looks of, "why not?" over and over and then the awkward silence.

By day three, I was done; I was over feeling so uncomfortable, and all I could think about was how I could plan my escape without anyone noticing, but of course, that was never going to happen because I needed help to pull my tent down.

So I prayed, "Father, please get me through"

I woke up the following day, and for the first time, I felt relaxed and knew I could make it to the end. I started staying up late with everyone else. I had only minimum alcohol to drink so I wouldn't be tempted to relax too much. I was warned before I left by the Holy Spirit to be on my guard, so I took that seriously.

Then it was the Sabbath Day....they had planned a champagne breakfast for me for my birthday, which was so lovely and thoughtful. I excused myself after breakfast to leave camp for a few hours to keep the Sabbath Day with the Father as I knew there would be no peace if I stayed, and that was the straw that broke the camels back, as we say here in Australia.

What came next was a barrage of questions that most likely had been building up all week. Why do I believe what I do and why don't I eat pork, and why do I keep the Sabbath??? and no, I'm not Jewish.

I think we covered the whole Bible from Adam and Eve and how come there are now so many different nationalities in the world to Revelations and how," if we don't accept Yeshua and follow His commands, in the end, we won't be saved." And those last words were spoken by my daughter in law who had jumped on the bandwagon and literally had my back even though she wouldn't say she is a believer; she was evangelizing up a storm. At one point in the conversation, I explained how I had been a Christian since I was a kid but had only just started following the Old Testament as well as the New Testament and how it was one complete story. One of the guys, who was a keen fisherman, piped up and said, "Like fishing your whole life and then suddenly start reading the rule book," I was like, "Yes!! That exactly right" and laughed.

One of the families had a farm and had gone through the devastating bush fires in Australia and had lost cattle and land. The wife shared a beautiful story with me about how her little grandson had hung his favorite shirt in different places on the property with a story to tell why he chose that place. All around the shirt, the trees were burnt, but his shirt was never burnt. This happened multiple times. I asked her if that gave them comfort, and she responded, "Yes."

So it was moments like that I knew God was orchestrating this whole event, and the Holy Spirt was giving me the answers for all their questions, but honestly, they were getting it themselves. And when I didn't know the answer, I said so.

There was one more thing that the Holy Spirit did. There was a lady at the camp, and towards the end of the week, He showed me a vision of her as a younger version of herself, restored to her former beauty. So, I prayed for her, and during our vigorous Q&A time, it came out that she grew up in a strictly religious, pentecostal environment and had turned away from it all. I genuinely believe Yehovah is calling her back home to the fold, so I am keeping her in prayer and her family as well.

So, it was the 'fast and furious,' and I believe God did a quick work. He had given me a vision the night before I left for the trip of a 1 cup measuring cup overflowing with different seeds. I have prayed that all the seeds planted on this trip will take root in each of their hearts, and someone else will come along and water those seeds, knowing that Yeshua saves us all.

I am looking forward to the day I see the fruit of this mission. I am now convinced that wherever the Father sends me, I will expect to feel uncomfortable because that's when I know He is doing a good work, and it's not about me.

I have also learned why it was so crucial for me to be on my guard because, in that situation, I was a witness for Yehovah. I couldn't have done what He wanted me to do if I acted worldly, drank too much, cussed, and ate whatever I wanted. I also couldn't have shared the gospel if I didn't keep the food laws or keep the Sabbath, as these were the reasons why they had so many questions for me in the first place.

And because Yehovah is a God of overflow, He wasn't finished yet. After I got home, I was sharing with my son about the trip, which he already knew about because my daughter-in-law had already given him the full rundown. His response, and he also doesn't follow Yeshua, was, "Well Mum, I think that just shows what you are made of when you can stand your ground like that against all those people and stand up for what you

believe in." and that just broke me.

STUMBLING BLOCKS INTO STEPPING STONES: PRIDE

"What about you? Where's your recognition?" Satan whispers in my ear.

It can be so easy to fall prey to Satan's taunts. His words may hold a fraction of truth, but while they sound enticing, they're about as delicious as the apple in Snow White. Whatever God is doing in your life or however He is using you, Satan desires to do all he can to taint the good, sowing seeds of carnal thoughts and temptations into your mind. In ministry, especially, he will attempt to raise emotions of jealousy, pride, entitlement, ego, vanity, and authority amongst believers. Though the work God is doing through us is incredible, our human instinct can be to make it our own, taking ownership for ourselves rather than giving the glory to the Father.

Many of us strive to be number one or hear how our counsel has been encouraging, but what happens when those compliments taint the wisdom and skill God has given us? You might think that you're doing the Lord's Will by believing He is speaking through you, but Satan has a way of slithering into situations, disguising himself as truth to produce discord, false testimony, and self-righteousness.

This year, the Lord has been doing a lot of refining in my life, and, over the last few weeks, I've felt Him highlight an area I had no idea had become such a prominent issue. The moment God opened my ears to Satan's dangerous whispers, I quickly understood that I had allowed pride, ego, and vanity into my heart. Every time I spoke to my prayer group or was given a compliment, I began feeling the wrong fruit growing in my heart. While it felt good to be acknowledged and be God's mouthpiece, I knew things needed to change the moment I felt bitter after hearing someone give God the glory for the things I had been helping them with!

Getting to the root of the problem was my first course of action. Before I could address these thoughts, however, I needed to understand what they were and then seek the Father for wisdom, humbling myself before Him and asking that He show me how to turn this stumbling block into a stepping stone.

What is pride?

All over the book of Proverbs, we read of pride as coming before destruction (Proverbs 16:18-19), bringing a person low (Proverbs 29:23), and being one of the attributes that produce sin (Proverbs 21:4).

Nothing good comes from pride, and Yeshua warns us to refrain from becoming a prideful/self-righteous person.



dictionary.com writes that pride is "A high or inordinate opinion of one's own dignity, importance, merit, or superiority, whether as cherished in the mind or as displayed in bearing conduct."

In **Luke 18:9-14,** Yeshua spoke this parable to explain how the Father looks at pride (self-righteousness), "To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else, Jesus told this parable: 'Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.' But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.' I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.""

What is vanity?

When King Solomon went on his quest for fulfillment and purpose, he learned that vanity is meaningless. The book of Ecclesiastes speaks about these things, explaining that all attempts at finding meaning outside of God are fruitless.

The dictionary's definition states that vanity is, "Excessive pride in one's appearance, quality, abilities, achievements, etc."

We read in **Matthew 6:1-7** that Yeshua warns people not to be vain, "Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven. So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honored by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words."

What is ego?

"The 'I' of self of any person; a person as thinking, feeling, willing, and distinguishing itself from the selves of others and from objects of its thoughts." (dictionary.com)

We already know that the Bible tells believers that we are to die to our flesh, but what does that mean? What is the difference between the flesh and the Spirit? **Galatians 5:16-26** explains, "So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the Kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other."

Notice how each of the definitions go hand in hand, focusing on the same topic: SELF! Me, myself, and I! These attributes are all about YOU and lifting YOURSELF above God. I thrive to live a life of the Spirit, and yet I had allowed fruits of my flesh to taint the work YHVH was doing through me.

"Lord, I never want to be a prideful, vain, or egotistical person! Life of the flesh brings destruction, but your Spirit brings life! I don't want to be like the Pharisee who stood and proclaimed himself better than the tax collector; I am a sinner and no better than anyone else. I also never want to be the person who exclaims all the things I do for You in a boastful or self-righteous manner; may you judge my heart and tell me if I'm ever doing things for my benefit. Help me not walk according to my flesh, but according to your spirit, keeping your voice louder than my own. Amen!"

It's so easy to be led astray by our selfish desires; it's a lot harder to fight the thoughts and train ourselves to align with the Scriptures — trust me, I'm learning this every day! However, when we stop looking at the things we do or say as our own, we give the Father the space to move through us, transforming the lives of those around us. This life is about so much more than leaving a footprint on this ever-changing earth; we can do so much for the Kingdom if we take our eyes off our personal gain and seek Yeshua first! Of course, this doesn't mean that we shouldn't celebrate our accomplishments; we just need to be aware of what fruit the praise is producing.

I know many people are struggling with these temptations and trials. It's scary to be open and honest about the things you're going through, but if we remain silent, how can we be a help to someone who thinks they're all alone in this battle? Though I am ashamed of how long it took for me to recognize what I had been allowing Satan to sow into my heart, I'm thankful that the Spirit corrected me and is continuously teaching me how to take those thoughts captive, changing their evil intentions into good. What Satan plotted to be a stumbling block or downfall, the Lord has shown me how to create a stepping stone, drawing nearer to him in the process!

You can do the same! Your thoughts are not Satan's, and the whispers he's speaking into your ears do not need to produce fruit!
