The Resurrection of Yeshua: A Historical Fact Worth Investigating

Why Should a New Ager Care About the Resurrection?

 - o Hallucinations are personal. Over 500 people having the same hallucination at the same time in different locations is **psychologically impossible**.
- The Stolen Body Theory: Suggests disciples took the body and lied.
 - o Why would they **die for a lie**? Many were tortured, beheaded, or crucified themselves. Liars don't make good martyrs.
- The Myth Theory: Argues the resurrection was added later as a spiritual symbol.
 - o The resurrection was preached **from the very beginning**, within **months** not centuries. It's not a later myth, but the foundation of faith.

4. The Jewish Context Confirms the Resurrection is Unique

Unlike pagan myths of dying gods (like Osiris or Mithras), **resurrection wasn't a spiritual metaphor** in Jewish belief. Jews believed in a **bodily resurrection** at the end of time, not one individual rising in the middle of history.

Yeshua's resurrection **broke their paradigm** - which is why even skeptical Jews (like Paul) changed their entire worldview. If you want roots, this is the **rooted truth** that matters.
